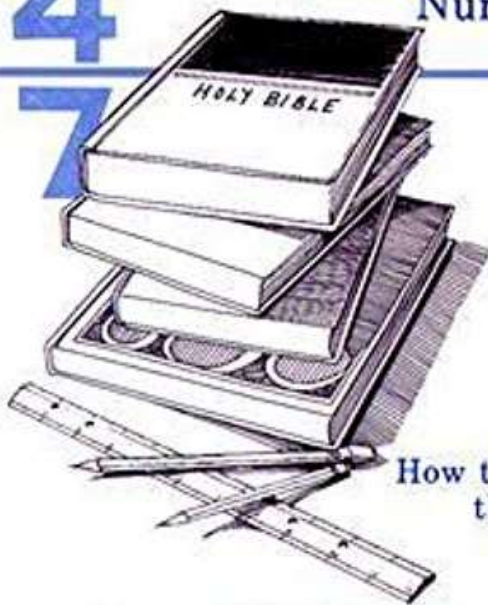

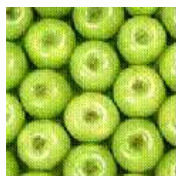


How to Count the Bible

The Inspired Word of God

Chapter 18

Hebrew Meaning and Significance Of the Number "7"



In this study we want to examine the Hebrew meaning and significance of the number seven.

Nachmanides (12th century Spain) explains a beautiful kabbalistic concept: Seven is the number of the natural world. There are 7 days in the week, 7 notes on the musical scale and 7 directions (left, right, up, down, forward, back and center). "Seven" - represented by the 7 days of Sukkot, is the world of nature. "Eight", represented by Shemini Atzeret, is that which is beyond nature.

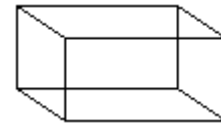


The Sages teach that seven are the attributes of physicality:

1. Height	5. Front and back (limits width)
2. Width	6. Left and right (limits depth)
3. Depth	7. The connecting of the other <u>six</u>
4. Top and bottom (limits height)	

The Maharal finds that the week itself is based on a primary idea. He attributes the symbolism of six and seven to the structure of space: When you look closely you will find that the physical has six opposing sides, which are: top and bottom, right and left, front and back. All these six sides are related to the physical, because each side has extent, and limits physical objects. But, it also has in it a seventh, and this is the middle, which has no exposure on any side. Because it is not related to any side it is like the non-physical, which has no extension [takes up no volume of space].

The cube, as a geometric shape, readily shows these attributes:



Six things of equal size, for example, circles or apples, exactly fit around a seventh circle (in the center) of the same size. So, if you draw a circle of any particular size, you can draw exactly six circles of the same size around that central circle, no more and no less (if you want them all to touch). This idea relates to the concept that the seventh is actually at the center and is the focus of the other six.

The connecting of the six attributes at the center of the shape fundamentally reveals the nature of seven. It is used for connection. This leads naturally to the meaning of 'seventy' which is an elevated connection.

Nothing can exist in the physical world without these seven attributes, *nothing*.

Every item in the physical world must have these seven attributes and each of these seven must also exhibit the same seven attributes.

"If six stands for the physical creation and seven for the spiritual in the midst of the physical (Shabbat), then eight stands for that which is completely outside our world. It stands for the World to Come."

ז, *zayin*, is the seventh letter in the Hebrew aleph-bet. The gematria, the numerical equivalent, of the letter *zayin* is seven. The name *zayin* means "crown." There are actually crowns, called *zayenin*, on many of the letters of the *aleph-bet*.



For example, a zayin with its tagin, its crowns, looks like this:



49 is 7 times 7. **When you square a number, it reaches its ultimate expression.** It is the thing times itself; Nothing can be a greater revelation of essence than that. Thus, 49 is the furthest reach of seven-ness in this world. And seven is this world!

This is the meaning of the number forty-nine (49). Therefore, forty-nine, that is seven times seven, is a statement that seven defines physical reality.

From this we can understand that music that affects the body has seven notes in an octave (the eighth is a repeat of the first):

Now that we understand a bit about the nature of seven as it relates to this physical world, lets explore how Shabbat is related to the number seven.

The Bible Reveals Seven “Things About Leprosy”

2nd Kings 5:1-19

Leprosy in the Bible symbolizes SIN

Most of us growing up in the United States knew little to nothing concerning Leprosy, and as recent as three years ago one news source stated, “California is not just a public toilet but now there is evidence that leprosy is on the rise in Los Angeles County.” President Barack Obama changed U.S. law in 2016 and allowed immigrants with blistering STDs and leprosy to migrate to the US. Medscape reported: *“LEPROSY, ALSO KNOWN AS HANSEN’S DISEASE, IS RARELY SEEN IN THE UNITED STATES, BUT CASES CONTINUE TO EMERGE IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY, A NEW REPORT SAYS.*

“HANSEN’S DISEASE STILL EXISTS, AND WE NEED TO EDUCATE MEDICAL STUDENTS AND PHYSICIANS,” COAUTHOR DR. MARIA TERESA OCHOA FROM KECK MEDICAL CENTER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES, TOLD REUTERS HEALTH BY EMAIL. DR. OCHOA AND COLLEAGUES IDENTIFIED 187 PATIENTS WITH THE DISEASE IN A REVIEW OF MEDICAL RECORDS FROM THEIR LEPROSY CLINIC SPANNING 1973 TO 2018. MOST PATIENTS WERE LATINO, ORIGINATING FROM MEXICO, AND THEY EXPERIENCED A MEDIAN DELAY IN DIAGNOSIS OF MORE THAN THREE YEARS, THE TEAM REPORTS JAMA DERMATOLOGY, ONLINE AUGUST 7.

MULTIBACILLARY LEPROSY (MB) CASES OUTNUMBERED PAUCIBACILLARY LEPROSY (PB) CASES BY NEARLY EIGHT TO ONE (88.6% VS. 11.4%, RESPECTIVELY), AND LATINO PATIENTS WERE MORE LIKELY THAN NON-LATINO PATIENTS TO HAVE MB, AS WERE PATIENTS FROM CENTRAL OR SOUTH AMERICA (VERSUS OTHER REGIONS).

I. LEPROSY IS INHERITED—sin came into the world by the first man.

Romans 5:12 – *“Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all man, for that all have sinned.”*

Psalms 51:5 – *“Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me.”*

II. LEPROSY IS UNCLEANNES—it is physical foulness. Total corruption. Leprosy infects the Whole Body: Skin, nerves, membranes and glands.

Ephesians 4:22 – *“That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old men, which is CORRUPT according to the deceitful lust.”*

III. LEPROSY IS CONTAGIOUS—the leper spreads his leprosy wherever he goes. They must cry UNCLEAN to warn others.

1st Corinthians 15:33 – *“Be not deceived; evil communications corrupt good manners.”*

2nd Timothy 2:16-17 – *“But shun profane and vain babblings; for they will increase unto more ungodliness. And their word will eat as doth a canker.”*

IV. LEPROSY IS A STATE OF LIVING DEATH—the incubation period of leprosy may be many years. Some forms of leprosy are known to last 20 or 30 years. A hand may drop off, a foot, or an eye fall out.

1st Timothy 5:6 – *“But she that liveth in pleasure is DEAD while she LIVETH.”*

Ephesians 2:1 – *“And you hath he quickened who were DEAD in trespasses and sins.”*

V. LEPROSY CANNOT BE CURED—no human power can deliver the leper from his disease. No human power can deliver the sinner.

VI. LEPROSY CAUSES THE INFLECTED TO BE BANISHED FROM CAMP OF CITY

Leviticus 13:45-46 – *“And the leper in whom the plague is, his clothes shall be rent, and his head bare, and he shall put a covering upon his upper lip, and cry, Unclean, unclean.”*

VII. LEPROSY ENDS IN DEATH AND AGONY

James 1:15 – *“And sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.”*

Romans 6:23 – *“For the wages of sin is death.”*

The Rich Man Discovered Seven “Things in Hell”

Luke 16:19-31

Men make great discoveries in this life, but nothing to compare to what they will discover if they die in their sins. The Rich Man discovered it all too late:

I. THAT DEATH DOES NOT END IT ALL.

Luke 16:22-23 - *“The rich man also died, and was buried; And in hell he lift up his eyes...”* He found:

1. Abraham alive... vs. 23
2. Lazarus alive... vs. 23
3. He himself was very much alive... vs. 23

II. THAT THERE IS A HELL.

Luke 16:23 - And in hell he lift up his eyes...

Psalms 9:17 - The wicked shall be turned into hell...

Isaiah 5:14 - Therefore hell hath enlarged herself...

Isaiah 14:9 - Hell from beneath is moved for thee to meet thee at thy coming...

III. THAT A MAN MUST REAP WHAT HE SOWS EVEN IN HELL.

Galatians 6:8 - *“For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption.”*

The rich man denied Lazarus:

1. Bread... He was denied water...
2. Comfort... He is denied comfort...
3. Mercy... He is denied mercy...
4. Attention... He is denied attention.

IV. THAT THERE ARE TORMENTS IN HELL

Luke 16:23 - *“And in hell he lift up his eyes being in torments...”*

V. THAT THERE WAS A GREAT GULF BETWEEN HEAVEN AND HELL.

Luke 16:26 - *“And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed.”*

There is a great gulf between:

1. A hog and a sheep.
2. A saint and a sinner.
3. Heaven and hell.

VI. THAT PRAYING TO SAINTS WILL AVAIL NOTHING.

Abraham was a good saint, but he could not help the rich man.

1. No saint can come to your rescue after death.

VII. THAT A PERSON MUST REPENT AND BELIEVE ON THE EARTH, OR DIE AND FALL OFF INTO HELL.

Luke 13:5 - *"I tell you, Nay; but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish."*
It is CHRIST OR HELL – 1st John 5:12

"King Hoshea" is Referred to Seven times in just One Book (2nd Kings)

Hoshea was the nineteenth and final king of Northern Israel. He reigned nine years –(2nd Kings 17:1). He murdered Pekah (the eighteenth ruler) to obtain his throne –(2nd Kings 15:30). He was *"evil in the sight of the Lord, but not as the kings of Israel that were before him"* –(2nd Kings 17:2). His name means "God is help". At the beginning of his reign, Hoshea was threatened by the Assyrian monarch Shalmaneser. He at first attempted to appease him with tribute money –(2nd Kings 17:3). Later, however, Hoshea joined up with Egypt in plotting a rebellion against Shalmaneser –(2nd Kings 17:4). Upon discovering this, the Assyrian king cast Hoshea into prison –(2nd Kings 17:4). After a three-year siege, Shalmaneser conquered Hoshea's capital city of Samaria and carried the citizens off into captivity –(2nd Kings 17:5-6).

Seven “Things That Never Fail”

Joshua 23:14

Many things fail us in this old world of ours. Things that we think are impregnable sometimes fail in critical moments. Sometimes friends, or at least those that we thought would never fail, prove untrue. Banks fail, health fails, and we crumble to dust.

I. IT IS VERY COMFORTING TO KNOW THAT THE LORD JEHOVAH NEVER FAILS

In Deuteronomy 31:8 we read: ***“And the Lord, he it is that doth go before thee; he will not fail thee, neither forsake thee; fear not, neither be dismayed.”*** It is easy to believe Jehovah, the Lord God will not fail when we realize who Jehovah is.

II. THE HOLY SPIRIT NEVER FAILS

The Holy Spirit is given to man to stay by him and in him. Each believer receives an appropriate blessing from the Holy Spirit (1st Corinthians 12:4-11). The Holy Spirit never fails.

III. THE LORD'S COMPASSIONS NEVER FAIL

Jeremiah, guided by the Holy Spirit, tells in Lamentations 3:21-23: ***“This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hope. It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not.”***

IV. OUR TREASURE IN HEAVEN WILL NEVER FAIL

“Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell that ye have, and give alms; provide yourselves bags which wax not old a treasure in the heavens that faileth not.” -(Luke 12:32-34)

V. OUR FAITH NEVER FAILS WHEN WE ARE LINKED UP WITH JESUS

Jesus prays to God that our faith will not fail. -(Luke 22:31-32). How could our faith fail when one who has tried our walk, was crucified, died, and was buried and is now alive pleading with God to let the Holy Spirit be our Guide and stay?

VI. CHRIST'S LOVE NEVER FAILS US

“And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour” -(Ephesians 5:2). Calvary proves what love is.

VII. GOD'S WORD NEVER FAILS

The Holy Spirit inspired Joshua to write: ***“There failed not ought of any good thing which the Lord had spoken unto the house of Israel; all came to pass”*** -(Joshua 21:45). In (Psalm 119:89) ***“For ever, O Lord, thy work is settled in heaven.”*** Why should anyone expect God's Word to ever fail? Jesus never fails.

The word phrase **“The Spirit”** is found 385X (7 X 55) times
in 16 distinct forms in the KJV Bible

The word **“Owe”** is found 35X (7 X 5) times in the New Testament

It is a Verb: ὀφείλω (*opheilo*), (S <G3784>), *opheilo* conveys the idea of being in debt or under obligation and may best be translated as “owe” or (as a helping verb) “ought.” New Testament writers frequently write about what Christians “ought” to do in their service to Christ (e.g., John 13:14; Ephesians 5:28; 2nd Thessalonians 1:3; 2:13; Hebrews 5:12; 1st John 3:16).

In the parable of the unmerciful servant, Jesus stresses the inappropriate behavior of one who has been forgiven a great debt: **“But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began to choke him. ‘Pay back what you owe me!’”** -(Matthew 18:28; cf. Luke 7:41). Not only are Christians under obligation to God, but they are also under obligation to one another. Paul writes, **“Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another”** -(Romans 13:8). This sense of spiritual obligation and indebtedness was the motivation for early believers to share their financial resources with others in need -(Romans 15:27).

It is an Adjective: φρόνιμος (*phronimos*), (S <G5429>), One who is *phronimos* is “wise, intelligent” in a prudent or shrewd way, acting in a way that is appropriate for the circumstance or situation.

The word **“Humiliate”** is found 14X (7 X 2) times in the New Testament

It is a Verb: ταπεινῶ (*tapeinoo*), (S <G5013>), In several New Testament occurrences, *tapeinoo* refers either to the loss of prestige or status (“to be humiliated, abased”) or to the lowering of one’s estimation of oneself (“to become humble in attitude”).

times in 13 distinct forms in the KJV Bible

It is a Noun: תְּפִלָּה (*t^epillâ*), (S <H8605>), *t^epillâ* is a common word in the Old Testament for “prayer, intercession, petition”; it is related to the verb *palal* pray or petition.

The word **“Grow”** is found 21X (7 X 3) times in the New Testament

It is a Verb: αὐξάνω (*auxano*), (S <G837>), *auxano* means “to grow, increase, become greater.” In Matthew 6:28 and Mark 4:8, it refers (in a parable) to the natural growth of plants. Luke adds that as a boy Jesus “grows up” -(Luke 2:40). John uses *auxano* on the lips of John the Baptist: **“He must become greater, I must become less,”** (John 3:30). As the forerunner of Christ, he will recede into the background since the promised one has arrived -(cf. Isaiah 40:3).

In Acts, Luke tells us that the **“Word of God increased” or “spread”** -(Acts 6:7; 12:24; 19:20). The missionary endeavor instituted by Christ -(in Acts 1:8) has increased throughout the known world. Stephen reflects that the people of Israel **“increased in number”** when they were slaves in Egypt -(7:17).

In the New Testament letters, Paul notes that though he planted and Apollos watered, God is the one who brought about growth -(1st Corinthians 3:6, 7). The church grows both numerically and spiritually. This finds expression in a growth in personal and corporate righteousness, as well as an increase in one’s faith -(2nd Corinthians 9:10; 10:15). The body of Christ “grows” -(Ephesians 4:15) and bears spiritual fruit -(Colossians 1:6), **“growing in the knowledge of God”** -(Colossians 1:10). Peter echoes this same theme, likening the new believer to newborn babies: **“Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may in your salvation”** -(1st Peter 2:2). This kind of growth in spiritual maturity is linked to growth in knowledge of doctrine and the things of God -(2nd Peter 3:18).

The Bible Notes Seven “Resemblances” between “Elisha and Elijah”

Elisha, the Prophet Who Received a Double Portion of the Spirit

I. Resemblance to Elijah.

1. There is a striking resemblance between the life of Elisha and that of Elijah. Not only do their names sound alike, but the main events of their lives run in much the same channels. They are twin figures in Hebrew history.

II. The Two Prophets in Parallel. *Both...*

1. Strike the waters of the river Jordan and passed over on dry ground, -(2nd Kings 2:8; 2:14).
2. Bring waters of refreshment in times of drought, -(1st Kings 18:41-45; 2nd Kings 3:9-20).
3. Increase a widow's store of food, -(1st Kings 17:10-16; 2nd Kings 4:1-7).
4. Raise only sons to life, -(1st Kings 17:17-24; 2nd Kings 4:18-35).
5. Perform miracles for persons outside the boundaries of Israel, -(1st Kings 17:9-16; 2nd Kings 5:1-15).
6. Pronounce sentences on kings, -(1st Kings 21:19-22; 2nd Kings 8:7-10).
7. Call down vengeance on unbelievers, -(2nd Kings 1:9-12; 2:23-25).

In spite of the points of resemblance between the miracles performed by the two prophets, Elisha was not a mere echo of his fiery predecessor. There was a marked difference between the temperaments of the two men, and their general attitude toward society.

Elijah was a solitary figure like John the Baptist. His life was largely spent in an unavailing struggle with the evils of his times, and he had his periods of great depression.

The Prophet Amos was a “Type” of Christ Seven Ways

His name means "burden" or "burden-bearer." He was a citizen of Tekoa in the tribe of Judah. A herdsman and a grower of sycamore figs -(Amos 7:14), Amos received a clear call from God -(Amos 7:15). In spite of attempts to silence him -(Amos 7:10-13), his message was clearly communicated. In many respects, as a prophet, Amos was like Christ in seven ways:

1. **In his occupation, a working man,—(Amos 7:14)**
2. **In his humility; he acknowledged his lowly origin,—(Amos 7:15)**
3. **In his method of teaching by illustrations.**
4. **In his claim of divine inspiration. "Thus says the Lord" occurs forty times in his prophecy.**
5. **In being charged with treason,—(Amos 7:10; John 19:12)**
6. **In the pressure of duty which was upon him,—(Amos 3:8; John 9:4)**
7. **In denouncing the selfishness of the rich,—(Amos 6:4-6; Luke 12:15-21)**

Seven “Things God Loves”

“These six things the Lord doth hate; yea, seven are an abomination unto him.” –(Proverbs 6:16).

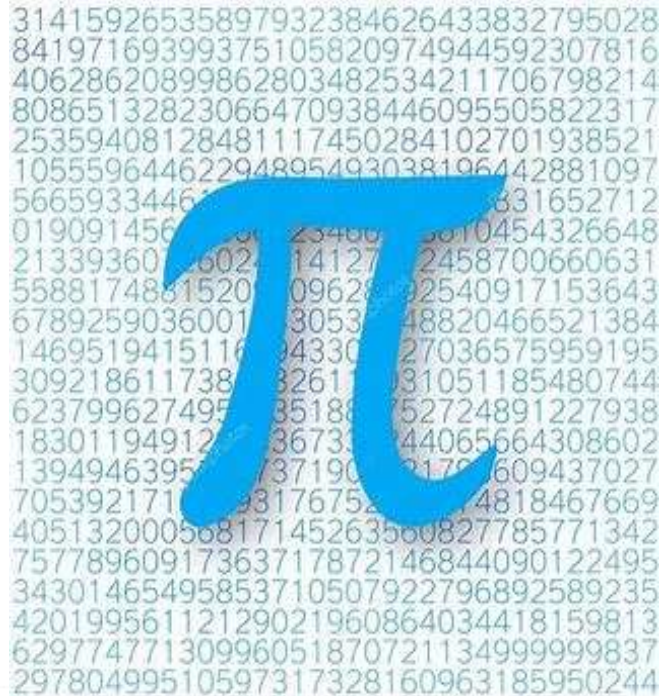

I have said for more than forty years that our God was a Master Mathematician, and I shared this in illustrations in Vol. 1 of this series in chapter 1. Below are more examples of how God encodes the Scriptures with the name of Jesus Christ. In Greek and Hebrew each letter of the alphabet doubles as a number. This is very similar to Roman numerals which are still used in English today. Gematria is the practice of calculating the numeric equivalent of words and phrases by adding up the numbers associated with each letter. Technically, Gematria refers to calculations in Hebrew while Isopsephy is the Greek equivalent. The examples below involve Jesus and the mathematical property of **Pi π** .

JESUS IN

Perhaps the most famous number of all is **Pi** the transcendental ratio of the diameter of a circle to its circumference. **Pi** is the most famous of the transcendental numbers and what most people know is that it goes on and on without pattern and without repeating. The circle was considered by the ancients and up into the 20th century to be the geometric representation of perfection itself.

3.1415926535897932384626433832795028



So how perfect it is that the first 169 digits of **Pi** should produce an absolutely perfect testament to the name Jesus Christ, the creator of the universe, God Himself and the logos of all math and science. When we add the first 169 digits together (169 = 13 x 13) we find a square filled with theological symbolism of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

How this intricate pattern came to be in **Pi** is something of a mystery. **Pi** is a fixed number that cannot be modified, beyond its original construction, yet it appears here and there and in many other places to have something like design features. How that could be possible is seemingly impossible to answer.

There are many more correlations that can be found in this dynamic configuration, too many to display here. The center line for example comes to 67 the mirror opposite of 76 Berashith and the sum of the ordinal for Lord God in Hebrew. Similarly the remainder 631 being the 115th prime is a double correlation, in that 115 is the 37th semiprime number.

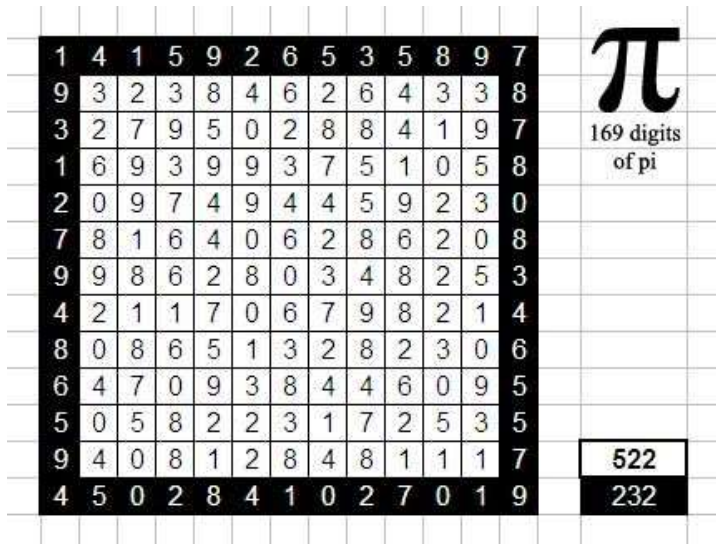

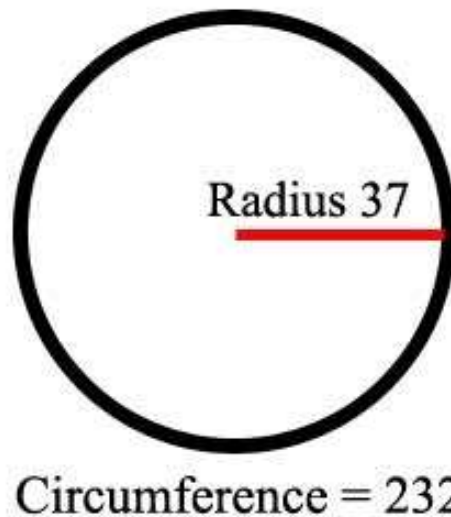


The number 232 is a well known number to theistic mathematics and it means with all transcendental perfection the Word of the Lord.

Mathematically we find a potent correlation with the number 37, perhaps the most important number in theistic mathematics. A circle whose radius is 37 will have a circumference of 232, the same

transcendental circumference we see on the 13th square of **Pi**.



The interior of this square renders 522, which corresponds in several ways to the Proterverse or Genesis 1:1. The first being the composite index of the 28 letters of the first verse. The second is the Power Set for the factors of the first verse in both ordinal and standard.

These numbers (**37 & 73**) reveal the identity of God's Son and the number of His name, reflected precisely in the spelling, in both Hebrew and in Greek, of the phrase Thirty-Seven times Seventy-Three.

The evidence is so compelling! It indicates that the King James Bible is the True Word of God, based upon the Hebrew Masoretic and Greek Textus-Receptus. No other English translation of the Bible contains the “Heptadic Design Feature” – this is unique to the King James Bible. There are other codes in the Bible’s original languages, such as “ELS” or equal distance letter spacing. Many theologians refuse to even consider God’s revelations even in light of the thousands of examples throughout the 1,189 chapters of the King James Bible.

And “Why was Noah in the Ark” for Seven Days before it rained?

Genesis 7:1-5: God then said to Noah, *“Go into the ark, you and your whole family, because I have found you righteous in this generation. Take with you seven of every kind of clean animal, a male and its mate, and two of every kind of unclean animal, a male and its mate, And also seven of every kind of bird, male and female, to keep their various kinds alive throughout the earth. Seven days from now I will send rain on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and I will wipe from the face of the earth every living creature I have made.”* And Noah did all that God commanded him.

Genesis 7:10 *“AND IT CAME TO PASS AFTER THE SEVEN DAYS”*. This teaches that the Holy One, blessed be He, gave them a respite during the seven days’ mourning for the righteous Methusaleh, so that they might repent, yet they did not.

The *shiva*, the seven day period of mourning following a relative's burial was also observed by Jacob's family. Strikingly, though common sense (and modern psychology) supports this notion of devoting seven days to deep mourning after a great personal loss, Jewish tradition does not see the mourners as the primary beneficiaries of the shiva period. Instead, the Jews explain that the soul of the deceased hovers over the body for seven days, and the specter of people mourning over the body it formerly inhabited helps ease the soul's pain.

1. Shabbat is the 7th day of the week.
2. There are 7 weeks in the counting of the Omer before Shavuot. -(Leviticus 23:15)

It is a Noun: εἰδωλόατρης (*eidololatres*) (S <G1496>), *eidololatres* means “idolater.” A second word is a Noun: εἰδωλόατρία *(eidololatria)* (S <G1497>), *eidololatria* means “idolatry.” Idolatry is not limited to the worship of false images, but it is placing anything or anyone before God as the object of allegiance and devotion. Idolatry was a constant temptation in the early church, since many new believers had only recently come out of paganism. This word often appears in a list of sins of the human nature -(Galatians 5:20; Colossians 3:5; 1st Peter 4:3); thus, there are admonitions to “flee from idolatry” -(1st Corinthians 10:14; cf. 10:7). The New Testament is forthright that “no idolaters” can enter the kingdom of God -(Ephesians 5:5;

Revelation 21:8; 22:15), nor should believers have intimate contact with idolaters -(1st Corinthians 5:10-11).

Yom Kippur has “Seven Secrets”

Yom Kippur (The Day of Atonement) is the day of repentance, the most holy day on the Jewish calendar. Described as a Shabbat shabbaton (Shabbat of solemn rest) in the Torah, Yom Kippur is a day of fasting, prayer, and reflection. Yom Kippur is the culmination of a period of time during the month of Elul in which Jews are required to take stock of their lives, to ask forgiveness from friends and family, and to take steps toward self-improvement for the year to come.

Yom Kippur is observed for a 25-hour period, beginning at sundown, by refraining from work that is prohibited on Shabbat, plus five additional prohibitions: 1) eating or drinking; 2) bathing; 3) anointing the body with oil; 4) wearing leather shoes; and 5) sexual relations. There are five synagogue services over the course of Yom Kippur: Kol Nidrei (evening service focused on the cantor’s confession on behalf of the community); Shachrit (morning service); Musaf (additional service); Mincha (afternoon service); and Ne’ilah (closing service). It is customary to also include a Yizkor service (memorial for those who have died this year) as part of the morning service. Yom Kippur services contain many recitations of the Vidui (confession), which is a list of communal transgressions for which we ask forgiveness. The seven secrets include:

- Before observance of Yom Kippur, Jews begin with good food.
- A celebration of the Renewed Covenant.
- A renewed review of one’s status and mission.
- Yom Kippur is an act of a Mitzvah.
- Yom Kippur needs the Tzadik.
- God takes back the adulteress wife.
- The Kohen Gadol has a right to us in order for the Mitzvah to be efficacious.

Now is that not something? We are told by the apostle through the Spirit of God to add seven things to our faith!
