Who Can You Trust? Vaccine Bait & Switch: As Millions Pulled From WHO, Trump Gives Billions To Gates-Founded GAVI

Being a retired Bible-believing Christian pastor, I follow news closely on specific subjects relative to Biblical End Times, and this report is one that causes me great concern, not just for the content, but for the confusion being perpetrated upon the American public.

Every time I read something that I believe deserves a "thumbs up" it is days or weeks later that a reversal statement comes from the President that causes me serious apprehensions.

In mid-May US President Donald Trump announced that the U.S. would be ending their financial support for the World Health Organization (WHO) and COVID-19 relief. The move was lambasted in the mainstream press as an out of touch politician pulling funding from a vital global health organization during the middle of a pandemic. To Trump's supporters the decision was met with the typical cheering and celebrated as another Trump victory against the "globalists."

To understand what is actually going on we need to examine Donald Trump's actions, not his tweets or media statements. This is not the first time we have been whiplashed by President Trump's conflict of words and actions.

Let us start by looking at the funding provided by the US government to the WHO in previous years. The latest numbers from <u>fiscal year 2018</u> (numbers are not available for 2019-20) show an estimated \$281.6 million to the WHO from the U.S. The records indicate that after the US government, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and GAVI, the Vaccine Alliance, are the 2nd and 3rd top financiers of the WHO. The US defunding the WHO actually tightens the technocrat's already firm grip on another global institution.

This means when Donald Trump stated the US will no longer fund the WHO, the Gates Foundation and GAVI stepped into the top financial role. Additionally, GAVI was founded by and largely funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in 2000. Either way, Bill Gates is the top donor and will continue to expand his influence and dominance of global health policy.

In 2010 the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation launched the "Decade of Vaccines" and called for a "Global Vaccine Action Plan." Since that time they have only grown their network and influence on WHO, GAVI and other organizations in order to shape public health policy in a way that reaps profits for the Gates themselves.

While Trump's supporters viewed the US withdrawal from WHO financing as a win for nationalism or a black eye to the globalists, the truth is a bit more nuanced. In early

June, the Trump administration declared support for GAVI to the tune of a \$1.16 billion USD donation. Trump's support for GAVI came via the first ever <u>virtual Global Vaccine</u> <u>Summit</u>. At this summit GAVI surpassed the goal of \$7.4 billion, instead <u>raising \$8.8</u> <u>billion USD</u> and securing commitments from most major nations around the world. GAVI even received a \$5 million dollar <u>donation from the Rockefeller Foundation</u>. GAVI stated that the funding will go to "routine immunization programs" and will also help the publicprivate partnership "**play a major role in the rollout of a future Covid-19 vaccine**." More than 25 heads of state and 50 leaders of international agencies, NGOs and private industry attended the fundraising event. Participants included Germany's Chancellor Angela Merkel, UN Secretary General António Guterres, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen, and World Health Organization Director-General Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus.

UN Secretary Guterres stated that the vaccine would not be enough and instead called for *"global solidarity...to ensure that every person everywhere gets access to the vaccine."* Guterres also noted that **"our individual health depends on our collective health."**




Donald Trump, GAVI, and Bill Gates

It was at this Global Vaccine Summit where a pre-recorded message from Donald Trump was played. In his video statement Trump said UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson asked him to record a message.

During his short speech, Donald Trump stated, *"It's great to be partnering with you. We will work hard, we will work strong."* Trump also called COVID-19 "mean" and "nasty" and said it has shown "there are no borders, it doesn't discriminate."

Trump's support for GAVI was echoed on the Twitter account for the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). *"USAID echo's <u>@Realdonaldtrump</u>'s*

words and is proud to be partnering with <u>@Gavi</u> by committing \$1.16 billion to protect people through vaccines, because <u>#VaccinesWork</u>," the tweet reads. (It should be noted that <u>USAID</u> has also been <u>accused of creating fake social media networks</u> in an attempt to foment unrest in foreign nations.)

It was actually USAID who first <u>announced</u> the pledge of US \$1.16 billion in February. The Trump administration included that \$1.16 commitment as part of the budget for Fiscal Years 2020-2023. The budget for <u>Fiscal Year 2021</u> included \$290 million for GAVI. Remember that the records from fiscal year 2018 show an estimated \$281.6 million to the WHO from the US. The Trump administration's announcement of an initial \$290 million investment easily surpassed the US investment in the WHO. Over the next three years the US will give more than \$800 million to GAVI for their vaccination programs. Once again, this puts Bill Gates and his organizations at the top of the global health pyramid. So what did Mr. Gates have to say about the success of the Global Vaccine Summit? "Since its inception GAVI has helped vaccinate more than three-quarters of a billion children ... And now, it's stepping up and saying it's willing to deliver a Covid-19 vaccine as soon as one is available to end the pandemic as soon as possible," he said at the Summit. "We must also renew our commitment to delivering every life-saving vaccine there is to every child on earth."

The Trump administration's support for the development of vaccines to fight COVID-19 is also visible in a more recent virtual event organized by <u>Global Citizen</u> and the European Commission. On June 27, Global Citizen hosted the "Global Goal: Unite for Our Future – The Concert" which was supported by Bloomberg Philanthropies, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Wellcome Trust, and Corporate Partners Citi, Procter & Gamble, SAP, Verizon and Vodafone. Once again, the funds raised at the event went to the Gates-founded GAVI.

During this event, Kelly Craft, United States Ambassador to the United Nations announced the US commitment of \$545 million for GAVI towards COVID-19 relief efforts. *"Together, we must work in an open, transparent, and supportive manner to build a safer, more resilient world. We must be the true multilateralist in the best sense of the word, working toward the common good,"* <u>Craft said</u>.


At a <u>May 2020 virtual summit</u>, also organized by the European Commission, the Trump administration committed to giving another <u>\$775 million</u> in emergency health, humanitarian, economic and development aid for governments, international organizations and charities fighting the pandemic. At this same event the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation contributed \$125 million.

Either Way, Gates Wins

Taken together – the May payment of \$775 million; the early June announcement of \$1.16 billion; and the late June gift of \$545 million – these taxpayer funded investments will provide abundant resources for GAVI, and subsequently, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. These funds easily outweigh the paltry \$281.6 million the US was giving to the WHO.

It is important to understand that the WHO is a part of the United Nations, which itself is an "intergovernmental organization" that is attempting to replace nation-states as we know them today in favor of global governance schemes. GAVI is a "public-private partnership" where governmental bodies and private organizations partner up to provide some sort of public service. Neither of these organizations has been elected by the free people of the nations in which they operate.

Despite this fact, the Trump administration is continuing to give billions to GAVI and in doing so, furthering Bill Gates' goal to vaccinate 7 billion people. Trump may have pulled funds from the WHO, but that decision allows Gates to take full control of WHO policy and continue to use US taxpayer dollars to fund vaccine projects, including a rushed vaccine for COVID-19. This was likely the plan the whole time.



As we have clearly demonstrated in previous reports, Gates has an outsized influence on the COVID-19 recovery and global health in general. A 2015 report titled, <u>Philanthropic Power and Development: Who shapes the agenda?</u>, examines the influence of global philanthropy and provides examples of the undue influence Gates and others can wield. The report noted that researchers have been critical of GAVI for following a "Gates-approach" on global health challenges, "focusing on disease-specific vertical health interventions (through vaccines), instead of horizontal and holistic approaches (e.g., health system strengthening)."

Further, in May 2019, Gavi CEO Seth Berkley referred to <u>"anti-vaccine sentiment" as a disease</u> that needs to be censored from the internet. Berkley's statements are perfectly in line with Bill Gates' vision and the larger agenda of eugenics. The public cannot be allowed to question the safety of vaccines — no matter how rushed they are. This is why the Trump administration appointed a Big Pharma lackey to head "Operation Warp Speed," Trump's plan to fast track the development of vaccines for COVID-19. In May, <u>Trump appointed Moncef Slaoui</u>, a former executive with vaccine manufacturer GlaxoSmithKline, to serve in a volunteer position, assisted by Army Gen. Gustave Perna, the commander of United States Army Materiel Command. According to the Trump administration, Operation Warp Speed program is focusing on four vaccines, with the hopes of testing and producing 100 million doses by October 2020, 200 million by December, and 300 million doses by January. Slaoui has said he believes the goal of vaccines by January 2021 is a "credible goal."

Once again, Gates' fingerprints are all over the situation. Slaoui himself has a long history with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, sitting on the boards of companies that are connected to the organization.

It appears that despite the public pronouncements of divesting from the WHO or tweets about standing up to the globalists, the Trump administration continues to push the agenda to vaccinate every person on the planet.



Question Everything, Come To Your Own Conclusions.

Bill Gates is regretting things left undone. Gates is sorry he hasn't done "more to call attention to the danger" of a pandemic." In an interview, Gates said, "I feel terrible. The whole point of talking about it was that we could take action and minimize the damage."

For his critics, rather than minimizing the damage, Gates has done too much to set a course of action having disastrous unanticipated consequences. Gates, the billionaire philanthropist, has become a supervillain.

Since April, over 500,000 people have signed <u>a petition at whitehouse.gov</u> calling for an investigation of the Gates Foundation for "medical malpractice and crimes against humanity."

Admirers of Gates <u>blame</u> "anti-vaccine activists and conspiracy-minded posters" for spreading "misinformation" damaging to Bill Gates's reputation. In May, one essay <u>claimed to debunk</u> the assertion that Gates plans to make South Africans early test subjects for a COVID-19 vaccine. A month later, the "myth" <u>was revealed to be true.</u>

Gates has taken up the cause of global warming too. He is <u>funding a mad</u> <u>geoengineering scheme at Harvard</u> to partially block sunlight. Imagine setting in

motion a "solution" that has the potential to <u>destroy all life on earth</u>. Gates's hubris seems boundless.

You don't need a conspiracy theory to explain Bill Gates's transformation from entrepreneur to supervillain. Gates has always been a ruthless zealot. Yet when he was at Microsoft, his worst character flaws were held in check by the demands of running a competitive business and the necessity of meeting the needs of consumers. As a philanthropist, he is not disciplined by forces of the marketplace. Empowered by government coercion, there is nothing to keep him or us from his worst instincts.

Good intentions simply don't matter!

Gates is ready to give away most of his vast fortune, in his words, to "coordinated global action" to prevent disease. You might give Gates high marks for his good intentions. History is full of reasons why we should not trust those with good intentions. A common trope in movies and comics is the supervillain who is ready to sacrifice the well-being of many people to further a warped pursuit they see as noble.

In his book <u>Capitalism and Freedom</u>, Milton Friedman explained why "concentrated power is not rendered harmless by the good intentions of those who create it." Friedman pointed to internal threats to freedom that are far more difficult to see than external threats:

"It is the internal threat coming from men of good intentions and good will who wish to reform us. Impatient with the slowness of persuasion and example to achieve the great social changes they envision, they are anxious to use the power of the state to achieve their ends and confident of their own ability to do so."

When Gates the entrepreneur was wrong, he was held accountable by consumers and competitive forces. When Gates the philanthropist is wrong, politicians and academics will evaluate him by different criteria.

When Gates co-founded Microsoft with the late Paul Allen, he didn't build Microsoft on good intentions. Paul Allen <u>described "ruthlessness"</u> as a character flaw of Gates. Gates routinely browbeat and denigrated those he disagreed with. Allen saw himself as the real innovator but valued Gates as a "sanity check" on his ideas. Allen and Gates needed each other to build Microsoft.

Others confirm Allen's view of Gates. Ed Roberts has been called <u>the father of the</u> <u>personal computer</u>. James Wallace and Jim Erickson interviewed Roberts for their book <u>Hard Drive: Bill Gates and the Making of the Microsoft Empire</u>. Roberts recalls Gates being unyielding: *"We got so we didn't even invite him to meetings where we were trying to come up with a new software approach or something like that because he was impossible to deal with."*

Roberts believed, "Paul Allen was much more creative than Bill. Bill spent his whole time trying to be argumentative and not trying to come up with solutions. Paul was exactly the opposite."

<u>A Financial Review essay</u> describes Allen "as an intuitive thinker who had a sixth sense about new products" while Gates "was the driven, clear-headed partner who turned Allen's sometimes random ideas into successful products."

Synergies between Gates's and Allen's differing leadership styles made for success. "Gates was explosive and confrontational while Allen...was thoughtful and empathetic." Fights were typical: "The two argued frequently, often screaming at each other in front of employees. But the fights, colleagues said, frequently resulted in good business decisions."

Why did the fights result in good decisions? On some level, Gates and Allen were willing to be led by consumer needs.

In his seminal leadership book <u>Good to Great</u>, Jim Collins found that the most successful leaders blended extraordinary "personal humility and professional will." Gates lacked humility and may have been a miserable failure without Allen's partnership.

The late Harold Geneen was CEO of ITT. In his instructive book, <u>Ego is the Enemy</u>, Ryan Holiday quotes Geneen who compared egoism to alcoholism: "The egotist does not stumble about, knocking things off his desk. He does not stammer or drool. No, instead, he becomes more and more arrogant, and some people, not knowing what is underneath such an attitude, mistake his arrogance for a sense of power and selfconfidence."

A leader with an unbridled ego is a danger, Geneen explained:

"Whether in middle management or top management, unbridled personal egotism blinds a man to the realities around him; more and more he comes to live in a world of his own imagination; and because he sincerely believes he can do no wrong, he becomes a menace to the men and women who have to work under his direction."

Holiday adds, "If ego is the voice that tells us we're better than we really are, we can say ego inhibits true success by preventing a direct and honest connection to the world around us."

Market forces reward businesses that maintain an ongoing "direct and honest connection" to the needs of consumers. <u>Ludwig von Mises explained</u> why consumers are the real "bosses:"

"[Consumers], by their buying and by their abstention from buying, decide who should own the capital and run the plants. They determine what should be produced and in what quantity and quality. Their attitudes result either in profit or in loss for the enterpriser. They make poor men rich and rich men poor.

The consumers are merciless. They never buy in order to benefit a less efficient producer and to protect him against the consequences of his failure to manage better. They want to be served as well as possible. And the working of the capitalist system forces the entrepreneur to obey the orders issued by the consumers."

I share these excellent insights into a man who is a megalomaniac and driven by an unbridled ego. The likes of Bill & Melinda Gates is to be feared and checked!



Farrakhan: Fauci, Gates Foundation 'Want to Depopulate the Earth'

Dr. Anthony Fauci and Bill and Melinda Gates are seeking to "depopulate the Earth" by pushing potential vaccines to end the global coronavirus pandemic, Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan said Saturday in a video that went viral online.

"They're making money now, plotting to give seven billion, five-hundred million people a vaccination," Farrakhan, 87, said in a <u>July 4 speech</u>. "Dr. Fauci, Bill Gates and Melinda

— you want to depopulate the Earth. What the hell gives you that right? Who are you to sit down with your billions and talk about who can live, and who should die?"

At the Nation of Islam in Chicago, Farrakhan issued anti-vaxxer messaging, saying the only way to stop the virus is to repent your sins.

"I say to the African presidents: Do not take their medications," he said. He is calling on his followers to come together – virologists, epidemiologists and students of biology and chemistry – for a meeting to investigate the well-funded medicine initiatives, which "vaccinate you with their history of treachery."

"I say to my brothers and sisters in Africa, if they come up with a vaccine, be careful," he said. "Don't let them vaccinate you with their history of treachery through vaccines, through medication."



Louis Farrakhan's address to Afro-Americans and Africans comes as a push-back to the entire issue of vaccines, and regardless of what you know or believe about Minister

Farrakhan, he gets heard by the world. Many in the media attack Minister Farrakhan's address as hate speech.

The funny thing about the DeSean Jackson Instagram saga is that I'm willing to bet that most people under the age of 35 don't know a single thing about Louis Farrakhan or the Nation of Islam.

For the typical suburban white Philadelphia kid, our introduction to the NOI was probably the Wu Tang Clan, since white kids loved the Wu and they used to rap about topics like the Tribe of Shabazz, which was an ancient black nation that migrated to Africa according to Nation of Islam teachings.

The NOI is an African-American religious and political movement, founded back in the 1930s by a guy named Wallace Muhammad. It's hard to explain their wonky beliefs in a couple of paragraphs, but it's an extremist Islam off-shoot that claims to promote the spiritual, social, and economic uplifting of black men and women here in the United States. Malcolm X was prominently involved in the Nation of Islam before his assassination, and Farrakhan has been running the show as a controversial figure since 1977.

A lot of what you'll hear from Farrakhan is a pro-black message, and that's what he was sharing on the Fourth of July, in a three-hour speech that DeSean referenced on his Instagram page. The speech itself was not blatantly anti-Semitic or homophobic or racist, but the reason D Jax is getting dragged (in addition to the fake Hitler quote) is because Farrakhan has a history of saying unacceptable things in other comments made over the years.

This speech, specifically, touched on COVID-19, racism, and police brutality in America. It was delivered during a time when the Black Lives Matter movement has become prominent in the aftermath of George Floyd's murder, when calls for reform have become more amplified than anything we've seen in recent years. Saturday, Farrakhan specifically called on President Trump and other world leaders to atone for their sins, while talking about the current "dissatisfied" climate in this country.

Here's more of the summary, via Revolt:

Despite what's in the Declaration of Independence, Farrakhan said America has never been a country by, for, and of the people. "This is a country that was never made with a woman in mind, therefore they had to suffer before voting," he said. "This country was never made for the slave because they only fashioned us a $\frac{3}{5}$ of a human. This country wasn't made for poor people. It was made for white people of privilege, of scholarship, and who felt they were **masters of God's earth**. But, no lesser being deserves that privilege. How did we become lesser beings?"

The minister added that Thomas Jefferson wrote beautiful words in the Declaration of Independence, but his heart wasn't there to fulfill it. "You can't say all men are created equal and hold another nation enslaved," continued Farrakhan. "So, the dog whistle in

Trump's 'Make America Great Again' [really means] 'Make America White Again.' That's why white nationalists are fleeing to his call. The question we have to ask is, '**Are you a hypocrite, America?**' If you didn't mean for the black, poor, and woman to enjoy full rights of citizenship, what did you mean?" The leader also warned the powers that be, "You can't pacify us with a smooth, crooked tongue. We know you. We've lived with you over 465 years."

Farrakhan, in the same speech, also disputed claims of anti-Semitism and racism while asking people not to take the Coronavirus vaccine, whenever it becomes available.

But the point here, to DeSean Jackson's Instagram post, is that Farrakhan was speaking to black men and women with a message of empowerment, one that you probably saw echoed on social media this weekend, the idea that we're celebrating a country where not everybody is treated equally. This is what DeSean I believe was referencing when he wrote that *"Farrakhan spoke facts this morning... you have to listen to the message."* Like I wrote this morning, it's entirely plausible that Jackson was hearing a pro-black, pro-equality message but maybe wasn't familiar with Farrakhan's history of saying absolutely ridiculous excrement.

As for the fake Hitler quote, that's the primary issue with DeSean's post, the part that's causing this story to blow up nationally, and that's what the Eagles are going to have focus on and address today. I have no idea why he dug up that quote, but in regard to the Farrakhan stuff, hopefully this explains why he was posting about him in the first place.

Minister Louis Farrakhan is never modest or reserved in his remarks, and his addresses have a way of proclaiming truth through his abrasive rhetoric. In his July 4th address, his comments regarding Bill & Melinda Gates, Dr. Anthony "Jaws" Fauci, the CDC, WHO, are not without substance and reason for alarm. Their record in using the countries of Africa as global guinea pigs says volumes about black people.

Rapper and entrepreneur Sean "Diddy" Combs tweeted support on Friday for notorious anti-Semite Louis Farrakhan by promoting the Nation of Islam leader's Fourth of July address that aired Saturday on Revolt TV, a cable channel founded by Combs.

Combs invited his followers to watch Farrakhan's almost three-hour rant titled "The Criterion," which also streamed live on YouTube and has already garnered over 600,000 views. In his speech, Farrakhan, 87, called the head of the Anti-Defamation League, Jonathan Greenblatt, and Jewish people "satan." He said, "Mr. Greenblatt, you are Satan. Those of you that say that you're Jews, I will not even give you the honor of calling you a Jew. You are not a Jew... you are Satan and it is my job now to pull the cover off of Satan so that every Muslim when he sees Satan, pick up a stone, as we do in Mecca."

"When you know who Satan is, you don't have to kill him [but] the stone of truth, that's what you throw. We cast truth at falsehood till we knock out its brains," he continued.

He also called Jewish Harvard Law school professor emeritus Alan Dershowitz "a *skillful deceiver*" and "Satan masquerading as a lawyer."



Greenblatt responded to Farrakhan's comments saying, "This is routine for Farrakhangive him a platform, he never fails to espouse hatred."

Farrakhan also shared the anti-Israel conspiracy theory implicating the Jewish state in the death of George Floyd.

"That's why you gotta come at us like a coward," he said. "Like snakes trying to wrap yourself around us so you could give us the treatment that you were taught in Israel. You may, as you gonna stop your police from going to Israel to learn how to kill better." He added: "Your days of killing us without consequence are over."

Ironically, Farrakhan also rejected claims that he dislikes Jews. He said, "They tell lies to make you think I am a bigot or anti-Semite, so that you won't listen to what I'm saying. So far they've been pretty successful."

Farrakhan then recalled Jewish comedian Chelsea Handler who faced criticism for posting a video of a speech he had given on racism. He claimed it was "imposters" who spoke out against Handler, who later removed the post. He thanked her for sharing his teachings and said, "Go back and listen to more of Farrakhan and get to know me. Not from the mouths of your lying imposter brothers, [but] from the God within." Farrakhan


concluded, "If you really think I hate the Jewish people, you don't know me at all. [I've never] uttered the words of death to the Jewish people."

Farrakhan additionally urged people in Africa not to take medication for coronavirus, saying, "Don't let them vaccinate you with their treachery through vaccines, through medication. I say to the African presidents, do not take their medications."

Rabbi Abraham Cooper, associate dean of the Simon Wiesenthal Center, told '*The Algemeiner*' he was not shocked by Farrakhan's remarks.

"At this stage of history, no one can be surprised by the rants of America's Godfather of antisemitism," he said. He also condemned Farrakhan's "lurid anti-Semitic conspiracy linking the Jewish state to the death of George Floyd."

"Imagine if Fox had run a parallel to the DC July 4th celebrations on its new platform," he continued. *"SWC awaits condemnation of Farrakhan's anti-Semitic screeds by leading American political, cultural and social influencers."*



In late June, the Fox Soul television network cancelled plans to air Farrakhan's Independence Day message.

In closing, I would agree with Minister Louis Farrakhan's warning to Black people; and, for all people, to heed the message of the Bible, refuse, resist, and do not submit to receiving any vaccines, flu shots, as you have no way of knowing what you are receiving and what it contains.

I would remind all of you, the United States is a signatory of the Geneva Convention, as well as the Nuremberg Code.
